#### **Questions and Answers About Sabbatical 2017**

Some of you --- especially those new to our church since 2010 – may have questions about my summer sabbatical.

- 1. When was it decided that you will take a sabbatical in 2017? When I was considering accepting the call to pastor this church in late 2004 and 2005, we looked to identify a way to find a sustainable pace at this church. A sabbatical after the first 5 years, and every 7 years thereafter, was an agreed upon part of the strategy.
- 2. **What is a pastoral sabbatical?** A pastoral sabbatical is a scheduled time of rest and renewal. Notice there are both the elements of rest so taking a break but also of renewal intentionally growing and stretching to be prepared to continue in ministry.
- 3. What dates will you be on sabbatical? May 24-August 16.
- 4. **Who will preach?** Pastor Tim will preach and take the lead in other matters. Recall, we've only had a full-time associate for 2 and a half years.

We should be in good shape for the summer.

- 5. What will you be doing during sabbatical? First - I will spend more time in spiritual disciplines (prayer, Scripture, worship, fellowship). Second, I will spend time studying and reading. It is hard to keep up with reading when the bullets of everyday ministry are flying. Yet, it is vital for the health of our congregation. Third, I will take some pure vacation. Fourth, I will work on big picture thinking for our church and the future. Fifth, I will still be doing some pastoral duties. I have three weddings and one grave-side service scheduled for this summer. Sixth, I will interact some with the wider body of Christ giving input on different ministries.
- 6. What should we do if we need to contact you? Please coordinate through either Pastor Tim or deacon chair, Terrell Carby. They will only contact me in the case of dire emergencies. But we are confident that Pastor Tim and the other leaders can handle most matters that arise.
- 7. Should we send you emails that say, "I know you are on sabbatical but I wanted to send this to you to discuss when you get back?" Please don't. Honestly, it's that sort of mental processing that I need to take a break from so I can focus on bigger picture study and renewal. Hopefully, I won't even open emails much of the summer.
- 8. Are sabbaticals really that necessary for pastors? Think of it this way. In the 157-year history of our church, my tenure of 12 years is easily the longest of any pastor. Prior to my time here, the average pastorate length was 4 years and much of the last 45 years there has been turmoil within the church. All jobs are tiring. But pastoral ministry combines one's vocation, spiritual life, and family life in a unique way. All three are blended together. Breaks are essential for pastoral effectiveness.
- 9. Why should the congregation be excited about sabbatical? The Bible motivates local churches to care for their pastors by assuring them it is in their best interests to care for their leaders. The author of Hebrews writes, "Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you. Hebrews 13:17." Likewise, Paul told Timothy, "Let the elders <a href="https://www.esv.org/Rm12.8%3B1Th5.12%3B1Co12.28">https://www.esv.org/Rm12.8%3B1Th5.12%3B1Co12.28</a> who rule well be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in preaching and teaching. For the Scripture says, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it treads out the grain," and, "The laborer deserves his wages." (1 Tim 5:17-18).

## **AWANA NEWS ...**

#### **AWANA By the Numbers - Some Things to Celebrate!**

Well AWANA came to its close for our 2016 - 2017 year on April 19 with our annual leader appreciation dinner celebrating almost 60 dedicated leaders dropping 28 weeks of their Wednesday evenings into the "service offering plate" as it were! This marked a great finish to strong year of "bricks" serving King Jesus by welcoming another group of almost 150 kids to AWANA (Matt 18:5). Sometimes we are asked, "hey what about this number or what about that number? Do we have those numbers?" AWANA Sunday in March, we shared a few of those key numbers speaking to how we are reaching our community for Christ through the AWANA ministry. Here are a few more key details adding to what we shared:

Families Served - 92 (compared to 67 in 2013)
Children reached - 149 (~750 over 5 years)
Cities reached - 9 (pecking order - DJ, Stillman, Byron) ©
Adult Leaders - 38 (average 40 to 45 over 5 years)
Youth Leaders (LITs) - 19 (average 15 to 20 over 5 years)

Combined Adult Experience - 245 years (next year this should surpass 300) Leader to Kid Ratio - 1:3 -- This is Exceptional! Many churches struggle with 1:4 or 1:5+

Demographic - 2/3 families not from Red Brick Church - of those 2/3, 75% have no church affiliation. Key Activities Observed Weekly - Kids having fun (Prov 17:22), learning and reciting scripture (Ps 119:11) and worshiping the one true God in singing (Ps 150).

Leaders engaging with kids in service to Christ (Ps 78:4; Col 3:23; Matt 18:5).

#### Next key milestone? Next year 2018 is 20 years of AWANA ministry at The Red Brick Church!!

At this time there are several key things on our minds as AWANA leaders that we could race ahead to prepare for next year -- even as we pause to try and take a break and be renewed in the off season. However, we need a much longer pause to appropriately reflect and give thanks to God for his continued sustaining of and blessing on the AWANA ministry. We thank you for your prayers and support this past year. Join us in celebrating His goodness and faithfulness to the AWANA ministry!
