Reviewing Tim Keller's comparison of "religion" and the "gospel" is a great exercise for our church family as I preach on 2nd Corinthians 8 – 9 this fall.

| Since I look to my pedigree or performance for my spiritual acceptability, my heart manufactures idols talents, moral record, personal discipline, social status, etc. I absolutely have to have them, so they are my main hope, meaning, happiness, security, and significance, whatever I say I believe about God. | I have many good things in my life family, work, etc., but none of these good things are <i>ultimate</i> things to me. I don't absolutely <i>have</i> to have them, so there is a limit to how much anxiety, bitterness, and despair they can inflict on me when they are threatened and lost. |

Women's Bible Studies in September!


M&M (Moms and More) and WOW (Women of the Word Evening Bible Study) will start up in September!

Grades kindergarten through 5th grade will meet in the church basement and will begin with praise and worship together before splitting into their classes. Each class of KG-5th grade is studying a different curriculum from Children Desiring God (www.childrendesiringgod.org).

Jr. High Sunday School goes through a Bible Instruction Course (BIC), and they meet in the basement of the Administrative building (next to the church). Dan and Lori Houston will be leading this class. Sr. High Sunday School meets on the main floor of the administrative building. This class is led by Ken and Kathy Mrozek, and they will be studying "Your Word is Truth" from www.childrendesiringgod.com.

Children's church will be available for children Pre-K through 1st grade during 10:30 worship service, and on Sundays when there is only one worship service. During the 10:30 service, children will begin worship service with their families and will be dismissed to Children's church before the message.
